

FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 2000

Your request for information has now been considered and the Council's response to your questions is shown below.

You asked:

Could you tell me what the Authorities total expenditure has been on SSL certificates for externally facing websites between 1st April 2012 and (up to) 31st March 2013? Where the certificate term was over a number of years could you give me the cost pro-rata, e.g. if a 3 year SSL certificate was purchased in 2011 and cost ?600, could you include a ?200 cost for this certificate.

Likewise if a 2 year (24 month) certificate was only valid for 3 months into this period and cost ?800 could you include a 3/24th of ?800 cost (i.e. ?100) for that certificate.

NB. According to the gov sugar.com website you had at least eight certificates in place during this period, so could you make sure that these are all included in your totals.
