Please note that due to the search on our system we can only pull out through a search those which are call "residential" care homes. We do not have anything from before 1997 as this was when we split from Leicestershire County Council and became a unitary council. You might like to ask Leicestershire County Council for details before this time. The Council does not hold this information. Therefore this letter acts as a refusal notice under section 17.1 of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 because, in

accordance with section 1.1 of the Act, this information is not held by Leicester City Council.

The details of agents of residential care homes and amounts received in relation to fees charged by the council for checking and processing Kingscrest VAT only invoices.

The Council does not charge fees for checking and processing 'Kingscrest' VAT-only invoices.

Please clarify what you mean by "agents" and we can consider your request on this question further. If you no longer wish the Council to consider your above question in this request it would be helpful to let us know. Should you not respond to this letter by 1st August 2013 the Council will close your request as allowed by law.
