

## **FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 2000**

Your request for information has now been considered and the Council's response to your questions is shown below.

### **You asked:**

**On how many occasions in each of the last five years for which figures are available, Leicester Council has sought a Judicial Review of a decision by another public body; and for each of those occasions:**

- (1) what the total cost to the council - broken down where possible by (a) internal and (b) external legal fees and costs - has been;**
- (2) whether permission to proceed with the Judicial Review has been (a) sought and (b) granted or (c) refused**
- (3) what the final outcome of the Judicial Review has been.**

There have been no occasions in the last five years where Leicester City Council has sought a Judicial Review.
