Your request for information has now been considered and the Council's response to your questions is shown below.

You asked:

Under the freedom of information, please could I have the details of how many times this bollard (on Aylestone Road) has been reported as hit or knocked over in the last 24 months. Also, how many claims or complaints the council has received.

ANSWER

There have been two incidents where the shell has been reported missing, as there was no report of RTA's, we assume that these were due to Vandalism.

Dates attended are:

14th May 2012

10th April 2013

We've also looked at our night patrols for 3 wks prior to the incidents:

Patrol carried out on 10th May 2012 – No report received of shell missing

Patrol carried out on 3rd April 2013 – No report received of shell missing
