

Freedom of Information Act 2000 – discretionary rate relief

Your request for information has now been considered and the Council's response to your questions is shown below.

You asked:

“Future Cycles is a Leicester-based Social Enterprise. They currently occupy two premises, one in St. Martins and the other under Leicester Town Hall. I would like to know what level of discretionary rate relief they receive on each of these premises from Leicester City Council, as a percentage of their rateable value (ie up to 100% rate relief).”

Answer:

Future Cycles Leicester Ltd, 1-3 St Martins Walk

100% Discretionary Charitable Relief (since the assessment entered the Valuation List on 25/07/2011).

The company's other property is included in the main Town Hall assessment and it is therefore not liable to pay National Non-Domestic Rates charges there (Leicester City Council responsible).
