

## **Freedom of Information Act 2000 – historical housing information**

Your request for information has now been considered and the Council's response to your questions is shown below.

### **You asked:**

**“I purchased my house in 2009 and wanted to know if there is any historical housing information available with regards to tenancy dates, owners, repairs etc to the property since it was rented in 1950s to 1982 when house was purchased within the Right to Buy Scheme. I specifically need to know if any change of boundary decisions were taken between council and previous tenant during this time period or thereafter up to me purchasing the house. Can you provide Citystreet A to Z evidence to show the changes if any please.”**

The Council does not hold this information. Therefore this letter acts as a refusal notice under section 17.1 of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 because, in accordance with section 1.1 of the Act, this information is not held by Leicester City Council.
