

Freedom of Information Act 2000 – Council underspend

Your request for information has now been considered and the Council's response to your questions is shown below.

You asked:

“I read in the Leicester Mercury last week that the council is underwriting £500,000 of loans for cathedral improvements and they are able to do this due to underspends. Can you give me details of these underspend?”

- **Which council departments have underspent in 2013/2014?**
- **By how much?**
- **How have these departments made these savings?”**

Answer:

A full explanation of the Council's spending in 2013/14 is being prepared for the Council's Scrutiny Committee on 31st July, and this will be available on the Council's website by 24th July. Therefore this letter acts as a refusal notice under section 17.1 of the Freedom of Information Act 2000, because the information you have requested is exempt in line with section 22 of the Act as it is intended for future publication.

The legislation allows you to use the information supplied for your own personal use, or for journalistic purposes. If the information is a dataset (which does not relate to the environment), you may also use the information for commercial re-use under an [Open Government Licence](#).
