**“Please provide information on numbers of street homeless recorded in the first quarter of financial year 2014-2015 compared to the last 3 years and advice any changes in the methods used to record this information”**

### Answer:

The way in which we record our figures for rough sleeping has not changed within the last several years as to be able to produce the most accurate and consistent figures for rough sleeping recording in the City.
