Arising out of the planning meeting for the 9/12th Lancers' Home Coming Parade, a number of decisions are required in order to move forward.

The Lancers have offered Combat Reconnaissance Vehicles to be present on the day. Either static or part of the parade. In 2009 a decision was taken not to have these vehicles on display. However, it did attract some press/question at Council to the then Leader as to why this decision had been taken. Could you please advise as to whether these vehicles should be used, and if so, is the preference for them to be static or part of the parade.

At the beginning of the Parade, which is proposed to be at Peacock Lane there will be an inspection. Could you please clarify what the City Mayor's preference is in terms of which dignitaries would be involved in this part of the proceedings. The inspection involves walking along a line of soldiers and engaging in conversation. It takes about 20 minutes. Last time, the Lord Mayor headed the inspection supported by the Deputy Lord Mayor, High Bailiff and Chief Exec. I have asked the Regiment to strategically place any Leicester soldiers that will be on parade that day to be positioned at the front so that they are spoken to.

The march past will take place in Town Hall Square, which will be approximately 30 minutes after the parade has set off. Could you please clarify who should take the salute. I write to ask for your support in an important issue. Today I met with members of the 9th/12th Lancers who were in Leicester discussing the possibility of a home coming parade when the battalion returns from it's current deployment in Afghanistan, and that this also include the regiment receiving the freedom of the City; you will remember this was an issue I asked your predecessor about after their previous home coming parade.

There were a number of issues that arose which seem to require political will to overcome, and in this I seek your support.

The officers with whom the 9th/12th had spoken said that there was an issue of costs of holding such an event of about . I believe that the council should take a lead locally in ensuring this does not prohibit such an event. The police should be approached and asked to see such an event as part of the normal running of the City, rather than something peculiar which they should seek reimbursement for. Likewise the council should absorb the costs and not seek it from the regiment. It would be perverse that the police and council spend huge sums when the EDL come to Leicester uninvited and unwanted yet a fraction of the cost of that day be an obstacle to a local regiment parading in their home town.

Equally it appears there is a suggestion that the regiment is not involved sufficiently in the City's life. This should be no obstacle as it is unreasonable. Unlike the Royal Anglians who have more than one battalion the 9th/12th are a single battalion regiment which is normally based in Germany when not on active duty. That does not mean however that there is no close link. On their last parade in Leicester I met two serving soldiers whom I knew amongst their rank. The regiment certainly recruits strongly from the City and County. It seems to me that there is little more that should be expected of people who are prepared to serve on behalf of us all and to risk their lives in doing so.

I would ask you to support the conferment of the freedom of the City on the regiment and to do so at the same time as holding a home coming parade. I believe this is the most appropriate time for the City to show it's gratitude following their current hazardous deployment to Afghanistan. This may not be in the normal cycle of awarding the freedom of the city but there are occasions when protocols need to be changed or exempted and I think this is one.

Following your e mail to below, please note that there is a royal connection in that the Regiment's official title is 9th/12th Royal Lancers (Prince of Wales') and that the Colonel in Chief is the Duke of York. The 9th/12th Royal Lancers was formed in 1960 by the amalgamation of the 9th Queen's Royal Lancers and the 12th Royal Lancers.

It may not alter the decision, but in view of previous events, I wanted to make sure that this was highlighted.

9TH /12TH LANCERS

Background

The Lancers have for some years been hoping that the City would honour them and give them the Freedom of the City.

The Council received a request to be considered for the Freedom shortly after the troops marched through the City in March 2009 for a Home Coming Parade. This request was acknowledged and they were informed that their request would be reconsidered during the next election term, as the Council had just agreed in 2009 to honour Engelbert Humperdink, Sue Townsend and Alan Birchenall. They were informed that it was unlikely that this would happen before 2014.

They were also encouraged in 2009 to be more involved with the civic life of the City, and build relationships, ie invite the Lord Mayor to various events, contribute/attend the Remembrance Day Service and Parade etc. This hasn't happened due to them being posted in Germany. However, one of the Officers did attend the Remembrance Day Service in 2009.

Granting Freedoms

Traditionally, this has gone to the Whips Meeting and each Group has one nomination, which is then agreed by Council (I am not sure where it goes in between).

Usually the Freedom is given in the 4 year election term for each Council. The last ones were undertaken in 2009.

Previous Freedoms have been awarded to people such as the Attenborough brothers, Gary Lineker, Sir Alec Jeffreys (founder of DNA), The Royal Anglian Regiment, (formerly the Leicestershire Regiment), Leicester Tigers, and Rosemary Conley. People/organisations who have a strong connection with the City. It is the highest honour a City can give.

9/12th Lancers

The Lancers currently recruit from Leicestershire, Chesterfield, Derbyshire and Northamptonshire. They currently have the Freedom of the City of Derby, and I also believe Northampton, with the possibility of Chesterfield soon.

They are based in Germany.

Homecoming Parades

In addition to the Freedom request, the 9/12th Lancers have made a request for a Homecoming Parade to be held on 24th November 2011.

Background to Homecoming Parades

In 2009, the Council received two requests for a Home Coming Parade. One from the Lancers and the other from the Royal Anglian Regiment. To avoid duplication and to minimise cost, the Council made an offer to both Regiments and asked if they could undertake the march on the same day. This proved to be difficult, and the two Regiments could not agree on a date. The Royal Anglian Regiment bowed out gracefully and decided not to have a Homecoming Parade. The 9/12th Lancers went ahead.

This received fantastic publicity for the City, national and international papers, and over 20,000 people lined the streets of the City to receive the Lancers back from Iraq.

The cost of putting such an event on (excluding staffing time and policing costs) can be in the region of £15-20 k. The format is a Parade through the City with a Reception afterwards for around 250-300 people including meal and drinks.

Current Position

Homecoming

I have met with 9/12th Lancers and have set up a meeting to discuss the possibility of having a Homecoming Parade (subject to funding being identified) on Friday 15th July. This would take the format of previous meetings, whereby the emergency services, agencies and division within the Council would meet to discuss this further and move forward if viable. At the moment, the preferred route (same as last time) is being looked into by Highways as to whether there are any building works/issues that need to be highlighted that would prevent them from having this route.

I have also asked if there is any funding that the Regiment can tap into as I understand there may be a fund which the MOD have for such occasions. The Lancers are currently checking this out and are coming back to me.

Request for Freedom of the City

I informed them at the meeting on 8th April that the decision for the Freedom of the City is a political one, and there is a process that is usually followed. I also informed them that Leicester was to have an Elected Mayor and that this may be something they are involved with too. I informed them that I would take this through the necessary process, ie make you aware of the request (e mail to you on 12th April) for you to decide the best way forward.

They had a meeting with Councillor Grant on 8th April following my meeting with them.

Next Steps

- A decision to be taken as to whether a Homecoming Parade should be organised
- A budget to be identified £15k look at sponsorship for the Reception. Highways to absorb costs rather than pass to Civic Office, City Rooms waiver their hire charges?
- The process for the decision to be made City Mayor, Whips, Chief Exec?
- If yes to above, Working Party to meet as per provisional date of 15th July and keep Perry in loop.
- Freedom of the City

Arising out of the planning meeting for the 9/12th Lancers' Home Coming Parade, a number of decisions are required in order to move forward.

The Lancers have offered Combat Reconnaissance Vehicles to be present on the day. Either static or part of the parade. In 2009 a decision was taken not to have these vehicles on display. However, it did attract some press/question at Council to the then Leader as to why this decision had been taken. Could you please advise as to whether these vehicles should be used, and if so, is the preference for them to be static or part of the parade.

At the beginning of the Parade, which is proposed to be at Peacock Lane there will be an inspection. Could you please clarify what the City Mayor's preference is in terms of which dignitaries would be involved in this part of the proceedings. The inspection involves walking along a line of soldiers and engaging in conversation. It takes about 20 minutes. Last time, the Lord Mayor headed the inspection supported by the Deputy Lord Mayor, High Bailiff and Chief Exec. I have asked the Regiment to strategically place any Leicester soldiers that will be on parade that day to be positioned at the front so that they are spoken to.

The march past will take place in Town Hall Square, which will be approximately 30 minutes after the parade has set off. Could you please clarify who should take the salute. Last time it was the Lord Mayor with the Colonel of the Regiment. This year it will be Major General Short, who is Colonel of the Regiment.

The Lancers have suggested that the Council may wish to invite the Lord-Lieutenant to be present. If the Lord-Lieutenant is invited then she would take precedence over all dignitaries present. It may be that if it is decided that the LL should be invited then the County are approached to ask if they would like to work jointly on the home coming parade with the City Council (and possibly share the funding).

At the moment, because of the Christmas Decs in Town Hall Square we are currently working on 50 vip's being seated in front of the fountain to observe the march past. Could you please clarify who the City Mayor would like on the guest list, and afterwards at the Civic Reception at the Nottingham Odd Fellows Club.

In terms of the detail and planning for the event, I would appreciate a steer as to the detail of information that the City Mayor would like to receive, and the decisions that the Working Party can make and what decisions the City Mayor would prefer to take.

Up to now, I have said to the Working Party that the decision as to whether the CR Vehicles are used, the inspection dignitaries, who will take the salute, guest list, Lord-Lieutenant's involvement are decisions that the City Mayor will most probably wish to make. The route, health and safety, roles and responsibilities on the day are at the moment being determined by the Working Party, which I am chairing. I have also asked that any press releases are co-ordinated through the City Press Office, and are also approved by the City Mayor. Last time the Regiment had a tendency to issue press releases without consultation with the Council which caused difficulties.

It would be helpful if you could let me have a decision on the above by the end of August.

THE freedom of the city of Leicester will be granted to soldiers of the 9/12th Lancers regiment at an event in the city marking their return home from Afghanistan.

Around 200 soldiers, many from Leicester, will march through the city streets, accompanied by two combat reconnaissance vehicles, in a homecoming parade on Thursday, November 24.

The parade will step off from Peacock Lane at 12.30pm, continuing along St Martins to Greyfriars and into Berridge Street. It will then move along Horsefair Street, past the Town Hall to Bishop Street, and onto Granby Street, before continuing to Gallowtree Gate.

The soldiers will then move into Humberstone Gate, where Leicester Lord Mayor, Councillor Robert Wann, will present the Freedom Scroll to the Commanding Officer, Lieutenant Colonel Will Fooks.
