

FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 2000

Your request for information has now been considered and the Council's response to your questions is shown below.

You asked:

- 1. How many individuals in total has the council refused funding to on the basis of suspicion about deliberate deprivation of assets every year for the past 2 years?**

None.

- 2. How many cases of deliberate deprivation of assets has the council pursued under Section 21 of the Health and Social Services and Social Security Adjudications Act 1983 every year for the last 2 years?**

- 3. How much money has the council recovered using this power every year for the past 2 years?**


