

## **FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 2000**

Your request for information has now been considered and the Council's response to your questions is shown below.

**You asked:**

**In accordance with the Freedom of Information Act 2000, I request Leicester Council to send me the following information:**

**(a) how many daycare centres providing services for (i) older people, (ii) disabled adults did Leicester Council run or fund the running of (in whole or in part), as at 12 May 2010; and what was the address, including the postcode, for each;**

Please find attached at Appendix A a document showing the in-house day centres run by Leicester City Council as at 1<sup>st</sup> November 2011 and those run as at 12<sup>th</sup> May 2010. The address and postcode for each of these establishments is included.

Attached at Appendix B is a list of external day services funded by Leicester City Council. The list reflects the position both as at 12<sup>th</sup> May 2010 and as at 1<sup>st</sup> November 2011, i.e. there has been no change in the list of day services funded during this period. All of the external day services funded by the council are voluntary sector services. The address and postcode for each of these services is included.

The services listed in Appendices A and B cannot neatly be divided into day centres for older people and day centres for disabled adults, as many of them do not necessarily cater exclusively for older persons or adults with a disability. In each case a brief description of the service has therefore been provided, in order to provide you with information about the range of people they cater for.

To the extent that we are unable to provide a list classifying day centres as services for older people or disabled adults, this is a Refusal Notice under Section 17.1 of the Freedom of Information Act 2000, because in accordance with Section 1.1 of the Act this information is not held.

**(b) how many daycare centres providing services for (i) older people, (ii) disabled adults does Leicester Council run or fund the running of (in whole or in part) as at 1 November 2011; and what is the address, including the postcode, for each.**

As indicated in our response to your question A above, the document attached at Appendix A shows the in-house day centres run by Leicester City Council as at 1<sup>st</sup> November 2011.

As indicated in our response to your question A above, the document attached at Appendix B is a list of external day services funded by Leicester City Council. The list reflects the position both as at 12<sup>th</sup> May 2010 and as at 1<sup>st</sup> November 2011, i.e. there has been no change in the list of day

services funded during this period. All of the external day services funded by the council are voluntary sector services.

Both of the appendices include the address and postcode for each of the establishments concerned.

As explained in our response to your question A above, the services listed in Appendices A and B cannot neatly be divided into day centres for older people and day centres for disabled adults, as many of them do not necessarily cater exclusively for older persons or for adults with a disability. In each case a brief description of the service has therefore been provided, in order to provide you with information about the range of people they cater for.

To the extent that we are unable to provide a list classifying day centres as services for older people or disabled adults, this is a Refusal Notice under Section 17.1 of the Freedom of Information Act 2000, because in accordance with Section 1.1 of the Act this information is not held.


