

FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 2000 - Trees, Debris Overhanging

Your request for information has now been considered and the Council's response to your questions is shown below.

You asked:

Please can you provide me with all instances of environmental reporting (e.g. anything to do with with trees, debris, overhanging) by the public, as far back as you have on the file/system for the first green area opposite 2,4,6 and 8 Fowler Close, Beumont Leys Estate. Please can you provide in a table format listing the date, what was reported and an identifier for the area.

Our current system for Trees and Woodlands holds all enquiries/complaints going back to 4th September 2007. Within this database there is only one instance regarding the aforementioned area.

On 7th November 2011 a complaint was made at our Beaumont Leys Housing Office by a member of public with reference to the trees in the location, with branches coming off the trees, wedging in other branches and then falling to the ground below. The complainant reported receiving an injury by tripping and falling over something that appeared to have blown off the tree and was covered with leaves.


