FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 2000

Your request for information has now been considered and the Council's response to your questions is shown below.

You asked:

Can you please tell me the number of bonfire complaints in the Rowley Fields area (residential and allotment related) to the air pollution team in the years 2010 and 2011?

ANSWER

We have already contacted you stating that we require further information in order to identify and locate the information you have asked for. In particular, it is necessary to know the exact area that you are describing as "Rowley Fields". Until we have that information we cannot answer the parts of your request that are undefined in this way.

Once you have clarified your request, we will be able to reconsider your request. As you were told in our email of 24th April 2012, if this clarification is not received within two months from that date your request will be considered to have lapsed. Under section 1(3) of the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA), a public authority need not comply with a request unless any further information reasonably required to locate the information is supplied.

The number of bonfire complaints to the Allotments teams for the same time period for the same area covering both the residential and allotments.

Leicester City Council holds no record* of any complaint being made about allotment bonfires allegedly taking place on the Rowley Fields Allotment during the period January 2010 – December 2011.

Historically we have received bonfire complaints concerning the Rowley Fields Allotment, the majority of which took place in 2007. The last recorded complaint was made in May 2009.

*The above search was conducted using the UNIFORM complaint recording database. Searches were carried out on the UPRN for 'Rowley Fields Allotment' and also on the 'Street Record' for all roads within close vicinity to the Allotments. It is possible that errors have been made on UNIFORM entries resulting in complaint records not being picked up by the search. This sometimes occurs where no complaint address was entered or both the complainant and complaint address were recorded as being the same; a common outcome where the complaint address is not known by the complainant.

In addition to the above statement no officer working in the Pollution team can recall investigating any complaint about this allotment during the specified time period.

Many societies have complete bans on fires on sites during summer months and have been very active in reducing the number of fires.

Recycling of metal and plastic is being undertaken to reduce the amount waste placed into skips or burnt.

The council provides a service to chip any brash on sites thus reducing again the number of fires. The Rowley Fields allotment site has frequently used this service.

The number of bonfire complaints to the central complaints desk for the city council for the same area and the same time period.


