Note 1

A 'programmed inspection' is an inspection of a premise or business which has been scheduled on the basis of a risk assessment or other priority setting exercise (as opposed to an inspection which occurs as a direct response to a complaint or incident) at some point in time. It would take a lot of time to manually go through three years of data we hold to identify which 'inspections' were programmed and which weren't. Section 12 of the Act makes provision for public authorities to refuse requests for information where the cost of dealing with them would exceed the appropriate limit, which for Local Authorities is set at £450. This represents the estimated cost of one person spending 2.5 working days in determining whether the department holds the information, locating, retrieving and extracting the information.

We estimate that it will take us in excess of 2.5 working days to determine appropriate material and locate, retrieve and extract the information in reference to your request. Therefore, this part of your request will not be processed further.
