

FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 2000

Your request for information has now been considered and the Council's response to your questions is shown below.

You asked:

How many people received adult care funding between 1st January 2011 and 15th August 2011?

ANSWER:

7015 people received adult care funding between 1st January 2011 and 15th August 2011. Includes 357 Carers who were provided with a Direct Payment.

How many people received adult care funding between 1st January 2012 and 15th August 2012?

7306 people received adult care funding between 1st January 2012 and 15th August 2012. Includes 389 Carers who were provided with a Direct Payment.

What was the total spend on adult care between 1st January 2011 and 15th August 2011?

The total spend on adult care between 1st January 2011 and 15th August 2011 was £75,673,066.

The above figures include service users and carers who had a service agreement in the above period. These figures include those service users and carers who were provided with a service which is part of a care plan as a result of a community care assessment. People who receive a service as part of council grant funding are not included in the above figures.

What was the total spend on adult care between 1st January 2012 and 15th August 2012?

The total spend on adult care between 1st January 2012 and 15th August 2012 was £74,483,221

The above figures include service users and carers who had a service agreement in the above period. These figures include those service users and carers who were provided with a service which is part of a care plan as a result of a community care assessment. People who receive a service as part of council grant funding are not included in the above figures.
